# The PPCA Celebrates 40 years of paddling. (Jane Hitchings).

On Saturday September 7<sup>th</sup> more than seventy paddlers turned out to celebrate the club's 40<sup>th</sup> birthday. The weather forecast wasn't promising but the clouds soon lifted and the wind abated. By midday, 4 hardened sea paddlers had already completed the 17-mile journey down from Calstock with the tide. So tough were they that they then joined the afternoon group paddle around the sound. The sun shone on a memorable scene, which I think sums up what our club is about: with Drake's Hoe in the background, complete with the Big Wheel on the skyline, a mixed group of sea kayaks, small boats and Canadians, as

multicoloured as a rainbow, in the foreground, whilst close ups showed the happy smiles of the paddlers.



Meanwhile, over in Clovelly bay, in the lowest of low Spring tides a much less graceful, but just as happy event was taking place, the mini Regatta for the young and young at heart. Jane, (me), who had had her eye on the big yellow course buoys belonging to Plymouth Triathlon Club since helping at their big event earlier in the year, had managed to procure them for the day, Jenny had rounded up the best part of a dozen of her Paddle Power kids and with Jenny, Andy, Sammy and Damian as supervisors the enthusiasm and glee

and mischief fizzed like electricity. Races around the buoys, race plans that were abandoned in favour of chaos and collisions and splashing made a colourful and happy scene. The highlight for me was a team game, where the children were given some materials and then left to design and make a raft that would


support and propel all 5 of them around the course. The teams demonstrated embryonic leadership and management skills and understanding of physics i.e. Archimedes Principles in contrasting degrees. One team built a superb sturdy raft and paddled the course whilst the others (whose main agenda from the outset was to get wet and have fun, I suspect) did not appreciate the great Greek's principle and sank before there were even 3 of them on the raft. They insisted on completing the course, had great fun amidst shrieking and more time spent swimming than perched on the rapidly disintegrating raft. The Canadian canoes provided great sport of course and the Pirates of the Caribbean scene, with the men walking underwater under the boat was re-enacted gleefully. Gunwale bobbing skills provided huge entertainment, especially as I insisted on having a go. I will give a medal to anyone who can balance with Lauren on the other end. She has many wonderful qualities, but grace and stillness aren't among them! The canoes provided endless opportunities for fun and games and all too soon it was time to paddle back to Mountbatten. The gloopy, sucky, stinky, black mud exposed by the extreme low tide was also a source of fun and distraction for the kids and I had to help retrieve several shoes and stranded small persons. Needless to say that the kit needed a good deal of washing off before it could be returned to the shed. So did the kids, but they just did what they had been promised that they could do at the end and that was to jump, slide or be shoved off the black beach into the returning tide. It did strike me that I needn't have bothered with a course, boats, race plans at all, as the children wanted to mess about in rather than on the water.

All the groups, by design, then met in the Isobar where Mountbatten had laid on a choice of three excellent curries. The bar was decorated with balloons and streamers but Mary's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary cake stole the show. It was magnificent and when Terry, our club president, lit the candles we realized they were Roman candle style fireworks. A glass of Prossecio was given to everyone to toast our club.

During the meal a raffle was held and £69 raised for the RNLI.

All in all, a great day was had by those who attended and the spirit that makes this club a great club to belong to, was in evidence everywhere. Thanks for organizing and helping are due to many people, The coaches who led the paddles and helped with the regatta, Mary, for her two very delicious cakes, Mountbatten for hosting and providing the meal and all the volunteers that I badgered and cajoled to help me.

# Roman Way and Efford. Crispin Gill.

Talking of plagiarism, and inspired by a recent Saturday paddle along the Plym estuary, I have copied this from Crispin Gill's book "Plymouth, a new history. Volume 1." The author is discussing historic roads in Plymouth during Roman times and describes a route called Roman Way.

Roman Way is situated on the second oldest route we can trace in Plymouth, an east – west road from Saltash to Plympton. It crossed the Ham brook at Weston Mill, then the head of the creek, the Tavistock Road at Tor, and the Plym at Crabtree. This was the Ebb Ford to the Saxons, a name which, in the course of time, became Efford and moved up the hill, as place names will move. The construction of Saltram Park on the other side of the Plym in the eighteenth century obliterated part of the route, but beyond that it is still used into Plympton St Maurice. The ford, still marked on the 1809 ordnance Survey map, and the road up the hill behind the Crabtree Inn (long since demolished) was known as Saltash Lane until recent times.
