### **PPCA – Current position**

### Membership

The club is open to all members of the public who have a British Canoeing Discoverer Award (previously known as 1\*) or are at an equivalent standard.

Membership can be obtained via the PPCA website, where the relevant fees are displayed.

#### **Activities**

The club organises a wide variety of activities all year round, they include:

- Coaching sessions held weekly for open boats, general purpose kayaks (GP kayaks), Sit on Tops (SoT), sea kayaks and, most recently, Stand up Paddleboards (SuPs) all at different levels of competence.
- Recreational trips (including overnight camping) in open boats, GP kayaks and sea kayaks.
- White Water river paddling (coaching and recreational) trips.
- Assessment awards in accordance with the BC guidelines.

- Beach cleans of the local area in association with other environmental groups.
- Scouts and Cub sessions.
- Currently developing links with Plymouth University and other clubs in order to help share opportunities and encourage inter-club liaison.
- Pool practice sessions arranged during the winter.

### Coaches/Officials

PPCA has 15 coaches qualified at level 1-4 and 5 other leaders, with 3 others in training.

During 2021 a subset of these coaches attended courses covering Advanced WW Leader, WWSR, First Aid, BC Update.

Safeguarding – achieved via British Canoeing e-learning and DBS certification.

Helpers – there are a number of members who assist the qualified coaches.

### **Buildings/Equipment**

PPCA is an affiliated member of the Mount Batten Watersports Centre (MBC). The club currently rents two storage sheds from MBC in Plymouth. One shed is dedicated for the storage of member's personal boats and the second shed is for PPCA equipment which includes kayaks, canoes, paddles, buoyancy aids, spray decks and other associated equipment.

MBC is on a level site providing member's and public (charegeable) car parking, including disabled bays.

MBC provides its' members with free parking, changing rooms and showers. Also available on a discounted, chargeable basis are accommodation, restaurant, meeting rooms and courses and bar facilities.

Club assets are evaluated as and when they are used, and also subject to an annual review to allow the asset register (spreadsheet and photos) to be updated. A snap-shot is reproduced below:
